
At Collegiate we know that students flourish when they are supported in a safe and inclusive environment and are engaged in activities that are challenging, adventurous and meaningful.

Thirty-one percent of Collegiate students scoring an ATAR scored an ATAR above 95 – placing them in the top five percent nationally and fifty-four percent scored an ATAR of 90 or more placing them in the top 10 percent nationally.
